What is this product?

Type

The product is a UCITS - Part 1 sub-fund of a SICAV under Luxembourg law.

Term

This product is an open-ended fund without predefined maturity. You may request the redemption of shares generally on each valuation date. The company may, however, suspend the redemption if extraordinary circumstances appear to make this necessary, taking into account the interests of the investors. Further, the company may restrict the redemption. The product may be redeemed early in certain circumstances as set out in the sales prospectus. DWS Funds ESG-Garant was launched in 2021.

Objectives

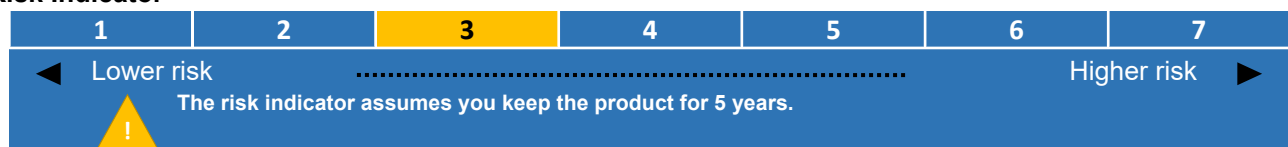
The fund is actively managed. The fund is not managed in reference to a benchmark. The fund promotes environmental and social characteristics and is subject to the disclosure requirements of a financial product in accordance with article 8(1) of Regulation (EU) 2019/2088 on sustainability-related disclosures in the financial services sector. More ESG information is available in the sales prospectus and on the DWS website. The objective of the investment policy is to seek appreciation of capital in euro. To achieve this, the fund pursues a dynamic capital preservation strategy. Depending on the market situation and the assessment of the fund management, the investments are switched between higher-risk investments (growth component) and lower-risk investments (capital preservation component). Higher-risk investments are, for example, equities, equity funds, higher-risk bonds and higher-risk bond funds. Lower-risk investments are, for example, bond/money market funds or lower-risk bonds. The objective is to ensure a minimum value for the share price while at the same time benefiting to the greatest possible extent from price increases as well as from positive returns in the growth component. The fund's assets may, at the discretion of the fund management, also be fully invested in either the growth component or the capital preservation component. The fund may additionally use derivatives (financial instruments whose value depends on the performance of one or more underlyings, e.g., a security, index or interest rate) in order to protect against extreme losses within a very short period of time. When selecting suitable investments, environmental and social aspects and the principles of good corporate governance (ESG criteria) are taken into consideration alongside the financial performance. At least 80% of the sub-fund's net assets are invested in assets that are aligned with the promoted environmental and social characteristics. In that context, the fund management is responsible for selecting individual investments. The return of the product can be derived from the share price that is calculated daily plus any distribution. Returns and gains are not distributed but are reinvested in the fund. This fund is a sub-fund of DWS Funds for which the sales prospectus and the periodic reports are prepared as a whole. The assets and liabilities of each sub-fund are segregated by law. As a result, assets of one sub-fund are not available in the event of claims against or insolvency of another. The shares can be exchanged for shares in the same or another sub-fund of DWS Funds SICAV. Details can be found in the "Exchange of shares" section of the Sales Prospectus. The depositary is State Street Bank International GmbH, Luxembourg Branch. Intended retail investor

The sub-fund is aimed at private clients with a medium-term investment horizon and basic knowledge/experience and who can bear a financial loss. The sub-fund can be used for general asset accumulation.

What are the risks and what could I get in return?

Risk Indicator



The summary risk indicator is a guide to the level of risk of this product compared to other products. It shows how likely it is that the product will lose money because of movements in the markets or because we are not able to pay you. We have classified this product as 3 out of 7, which is a medium-low risk class. This rates the potential losses from future performance at a medium-low level, and poor market conditions are unlikely to impact the capacity to pay you.

The following is applicable if you subscribe for or settle shares in a different currency than the fund or share-class currency: Be aware of currency risk. You will receive payments in a different currency, so the final return you will get depend on the exchange rate between the two currencies. This risk is not considered in the indicator shown above.

The following risks could be of particular significance for the fund: Derivatives risk, Risk of guarantee default. A more detailed description of risks and other general information can be found in the risk section(s) of the sales prospectus. You may lose some or all of your investment. Your risk is limited to the amount invested.

You are entitled to receive back at least 80.00 % of your capital. Any amount over this, and any additional return, depends on future market performance and is uncertain. The following limitations also apply: If changes in taxes during the guarantee period have a detrimental effect on the sub-fund's performance, the guarantee will be reduced by the amount of this difference per share, including lost market-based and time-based reinvestments. This product does not include full protection from future market performance so you could lose some or all of your investment. However, you may benefit from a consumer protection scheme (see the section 'What happens if DWS Investment S.A. is unable to pay out?'). The indicator shown above does not consider this protection.

Performance Scenarios

What you will get from this product depends on future market performance. Market developments in the future are uncertain and cannot be accurately predicted. The Guarantor, Deutsche Bank AG, Frankfurt/Main, guarantees that the net asset value of the sub-fund DWS Funds NachhaltigGarant on each valuation date will at least equal the guaranteed value that is valid for this valuation date. The guaranteed value is determined again on each valuation date and is valid for the respective following valuation date. The guaranteed value amounts to 80% of the highest net asset value of the sub-fund calculated in the respective observation period. The observation periods are determined as follows: In the first four years since the inception of the sub-fund, the observation period comprises the period from the inception of the sub-fund through to the respective valuation date. After this, the observation period comprises the past four years counting back from the respective valuation date. The observation period therefore results from a daily rolling review over a period of four years.

The figures shown include all the costs of the product itself, but may not include all the costs that you pay to your advisor or distributor. The figures do not take into account your personal tax situation, which may also affect how much you get back. The stress scenario shows what you might get back in extreme market circumstances. The favourable, moderate and unfavourable scenario values are the best to worst case outcomes based on a distribution of historical returns over different periods of time.

What happens if DWS Investment S.A. is unable to pay out?

The assets of the fund are kept separately from those of the management company, DWS Investment S.A.. An insolvency or default of the management company should not result in the fund suffering any financial loss in relation to its assets. On the insolvency or default of the depositary State Street Bank International GmbH, Luxembourg Branch securities held by the depositary on behalf of the fund should be protected but the fund may suffer loss in relation to cash and certain other assets which are not protected. Cash deposits of the fund deposited with other credit institutions may cause investors to suffer a financial loss if such deposits are not covered by any existing deposit guarantee schemes. Investment in the fund is not covered by any investor compensation or guarantee scheme. The following risks could be of particular significance for the fund: If the guarantor becomes insolvent, this may void the guarantee.

What are the costs?

The person advising on or selling you this product may charge you other costs. If so, this person will provide you with information about these costs and how they affect your investment.

Costs over time

The tables show the amounts that are taken from your investment to cover different types of costs. These amounts depend on how much you invest, how long you hold the product and how well the product does. The amounts shown here are illustrations based on an example investment amount and different possible investment periods. We have assumed: In the first year you would get back the amount that you invested (0 % annual return). For the other holding periods we have assumed the product performs as shown in the moderate scenario. 10.000 EUR is invested.

*This illustrates how costs reduce your return each year over the holding period. For example it shows that if you exit at the recommended holding period your average return per year is projected to be 7.7% before costs and 5.7% after costs.

How long should I hold it and can I take money out early?

Recommended holding period: 5 years. The product has no minimum holding period.

This product has no required minimum holding period. The recommended holding period has been selected due to its investment strategy and because it is designed for a medium term investment horizon. It is expected that it will be possible to achieve the investment objective of the fund within this time frame. You may request the redemption of shares generally on each valuation date. No fees or penalties will be charged by the company for any such transaction.

There is no change on the risk return profile when you redeem your shares early.
